2. To develop an understanding of the cultural disruption of Indigenous peoples in Canada and in the USA and of the disruption of their families and cultural life ways, including how that leads to attachment disorders, depression, and PTSD, all of which contribute to suicide risk.
3. To gain an overview that will include treatment strategies ranging from government policies, provincial mental health programs, tribal interventions, behavioral health treatment programs, and individual therapeutic strategies (EMDR, yoga, psychotherapy, and family therapy) that will address the multiple etiological factors when working with Indigenous women.
